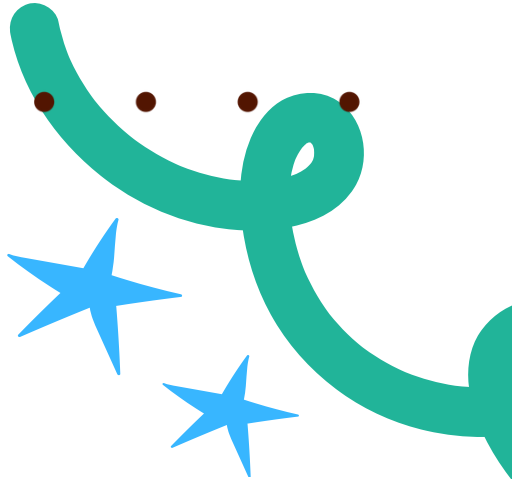
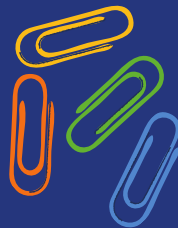

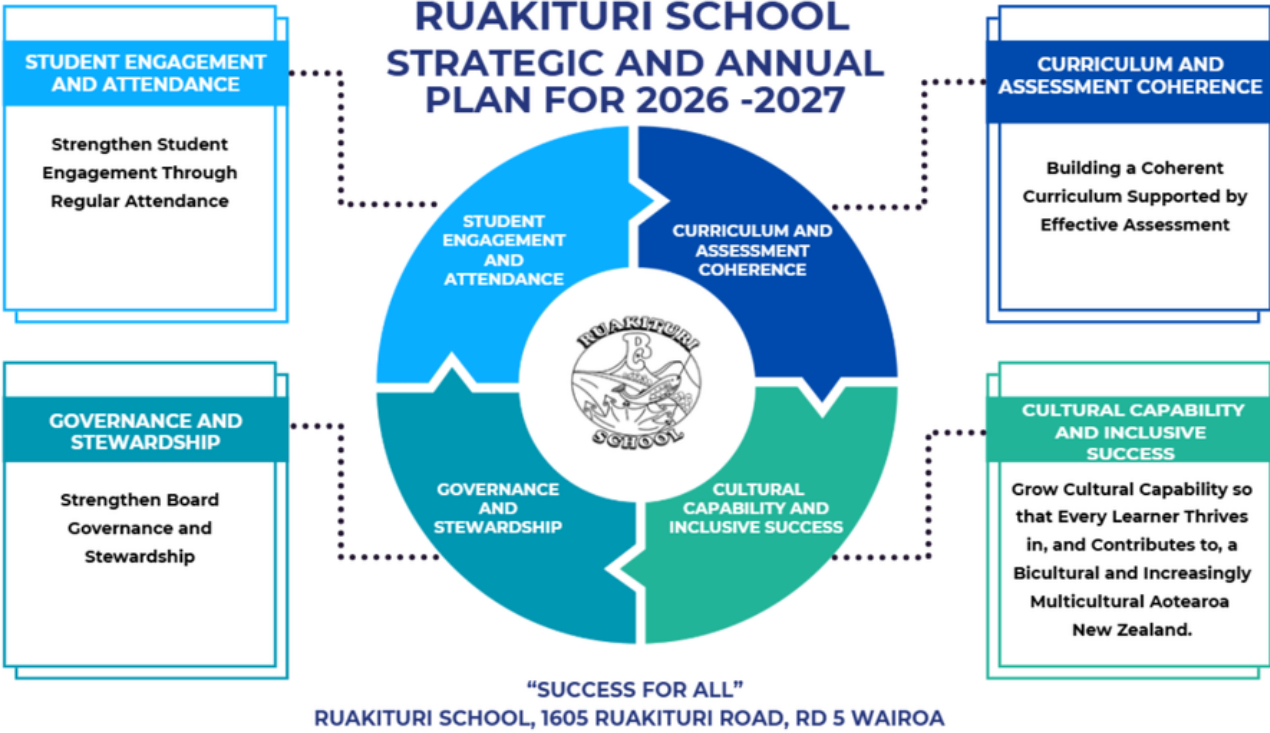
Strategic and Annual Plans for 2026



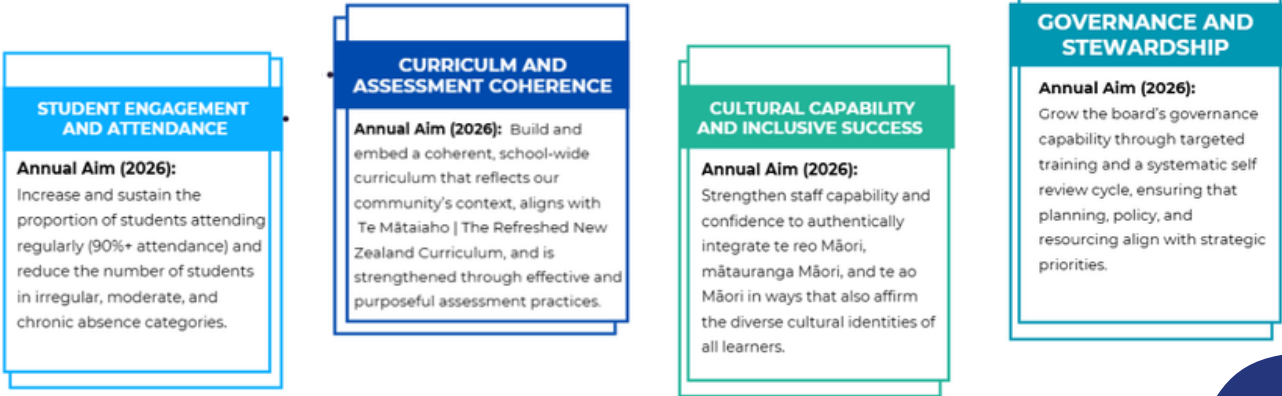
Introduction

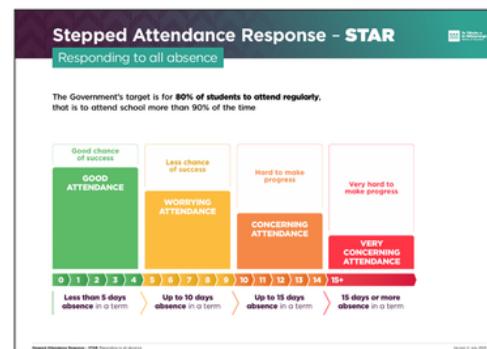

A reminder that recycling is collected on the second Sunday of each month.

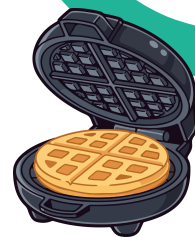
